**House White: Liebfraumilch Riesling** Rheinhessen, Germany

*Aromas of flowers and apples highlight this typically ripe and crisp wine from grapes harvested early in the season*

**Bloom Spatlese Riesling** Mosel, Germany  
*Juicy, fruity. rolling body combines with honeysuckle and peach aromas to satisfy Spatlese and Auslese lovers alike.*

**Lingenfelder Bird Label Trocken Spatlese Riesling** Pfalz, Germany  
*Clear notes of peach, almond, grapefruit and spice convene in one of Germany's most awarded affordable wines, a superb off-dry Riesling.*

**Hugel Gentil Riesling** Alsace, France  
*For those who find German Rieslings too sweet, we offer this delicate and vibrant selection featuring light floral and mineral flavors, with a typically dry Alsatian finish*

**Hirsch Gruner Veltliner** Kamptal, Austria  
*Dry, aromatic, and intense. Austria's signature "meadow flower" wine combines tones of flowery citrus, sharp greens, and earthy minerals in a unique, almost funky manner - like drinking a field of wildflower*

**Chateau Ste. Michelle Chardonnay** Columbia Valley, Washington

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**Egervin Bull's Blood**

**Eger, Hungary**

*Aromatic with full-flavored earthiness, this versatile table wine complements most any meal.*

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**Concha Y Toro Casillero del Diablo Merlot**

**Peumo, Chile**

*Dark fruit, coffee, spice, and herbs define this rustic, yet refined Merlot, whose fullbodied peppery tones are deftly pronounced with sharp tannins.*
